# LONDON

## INTRODUCTION TO LONDON

London is a vibrant metropolis hosting many attractions and events. It is the home to the Queen (gawd bless her), The Routemaster, The Tube, Tower Bridge and The Tate Gallery.

With mainline train stations offering links to Birmingham, Bristol, Bournemouth, Cardiff, Chester, Holyhead, Manchester, York, Liverpool, Newcastle, Glasgow, Edinburgh and more, 5 international airports from just 30 minutes away and a time to Birmingham of 1hr 45minutes, connections are fast and frequent.

London has two key points that will affect the meet – Leicester Square and Covent Garden – both are within 15 minutes walk of each other.

## THE GEOGRAPHY



## TRAVEL AROUND LONDON

We have evaluated the many ways that people will travel to the meet and know that many if not all will use public transport. We strongly recommend purchasing a Zone 1-2 travel card for the day. We also recommend checking on the National Rail Website ([www.nationalrail.co.uk](http://www.nationalrail.co.uk)) for any diversions or closures on the day.

An Oyster Card is a good way to get about London – be aware that PAYG oyster is not always valid on National Rail services and it is advisable to check beforehand.

## LOCATIONS CONSIDERED:

### TRAFALGAR SQUARE:

This has automatically been discounted, as it is generally crowded and has no cheap/easy food access points.



### COVENT GARDEN:

Located 30 yards from The Strand, Covent Garden has shops and food points with easy access.

In the centre there is various shops and cafes. To the bottom right corner is the London Transport Museum. A tube station is on the north of Covent Garden on the Piccadilly Line.

Wireless Internet and space is not guaranteed as this is a public location.

### LEICESTER SQUARE:

Located adjacent to Piccadilly Circus and with a Tube Station nearby on the Northern and Piccadilly lines, Leicester Square has a number of food places to hand as well as Covent Garden just a half mile away.

There are also a number of cinemas and shops to hand as well as a wide open space. There is no guaranteed wireless internet at this location.



## CONCLUSION

In getting to this meeting, transport should be easily accessible from all the stations rather than just 1. We also must consider that many people will be travelling from the North as well as the East or West of the UK. Therefore, we must ensure that we are within good times of Network Rail's Major Stations (Kings Cross, Euston, Paddington, Waterloo/Victoria and Liverpool Street).

Whilst Covent Garden offers some excellent food places, we must also consider budgets and this may mean people preferring places like Leicester Square with Burger King, McDonalds and others to hand. However, we must also take into a final consideration of Games we may wish to carry out and how easy these may be.

We therefore have decided to use Leicester Square as a central meeting point.
